1. Editing Tools: Up to iOS 12.4

- 1. Magic Wand
 - 1. App chooses corrections
 - 2. It can be a good starting place
 - 3. You can then make further changes
- 2. Crop
 - 1. Crop and Rotate
 - 1. Rotate by dragging on the wheel
 - 2. Level the horizon
 - 3. Straighten the shot
 - 4. Rotate 90° using the icon at the top
 - 2. Crop and Rotate
 - 1. Crop by dragging corners
 - 2. Moe image inside crop area
 - 3. All crops are NON-DESTRUCTIVE
 - 4. Original photo is always there
 - 3. Aspect Ratio
 - 1. Crop to a specific Aspect Ratio
 - 2. Click the icon at the bottom
 - 1. Original, Square, 3:2, 5:3, 4:3
 - 3. Scroll down for more options
 - 1. 5:4, 7:5, 16:9
- 3. Adjust
 - 1. Light
 - 1. Each tool has three parts: Light, Color and B&W
 - 2. Each has dropdown options
 - 1. Brilliance
 - 2. Exposure
 - 3. Highlights
 - 4. Shadows
 - 5. Brightness
 - 6. Contrast
 - 7. Black Point
 - 3. Each option has a slider
 - 4. Plus or minus original, marked by a dot
 - 5. Start with dropping Highlight
 - 6. Next Up the Shadows
 - 7. Further adjustments
 - 8. Slide to adjust each part
 - 9. Go to other options by tapping the three bars at the top
 - 10. Click Done OR Go to another Edit tool

 - 1. Saturation
 - 2. Contrast
 - 3. Cast
 - 1. Hue
- 3. Black & White
 - 1. Intensity
 - 2. Neutrals
 - 3. Tone
 - 4. Grain
 - 5. Edits can be Reverted to Original
- 4. Edit Video
 - 1. Choose Video and tap Edit
 - 2. Tap the filmstrip at the bottom
 - 3. Trim ends only
 - 4. Can send out to iMovie with three dots
- 4. Filters
 - 1. Lots of Creative Options
 - 1. Mono, Tonal, Noir
 - 2. Fade, Chrome, Process
 - 3. Transfer, Instant
 - 4. NONE

 - 1. Same 18 Adjust tools available for videos
 - 2. Same Crop Tools, including Level, Skew and Aspect Ratios
 - 3. Same 10 Filters
 - 4. Trim ends of Video
 - 5. When done, must Render new version on video
 - 6. Three Dots goes out to iMovie

3. Photos App: How are your pictures Organized?

- 1. Photos, Camera Roll
 - 1. All Photos appear here
 - 2. Organized in a number of ways
 - 1. Moments
 - 1. By Date
 - 2. Everything taken on a specific day
 - 2. Collections
 - 1. Picture taken in close days and locations
 - 3. Years
 - 1. All photos taken in a given year
 - 2. Click on one to enlarge
- 2. For You Memories
 - 1. Auto generated collection of photos taken on a particular date, over time
 - 2. Slide Shows include music
 - 3. Other related sets of photos
 - 4. Can edit: Title, Theme, Music, Duration and which pictures to include
- 3. Albums iPhone Creates
 - 1. Camera Roll (Recent): This contains ALL your photos
 - 2. My Photo Stream: If you have turned this on in the Photos Settings
 - 3. Favorites: Photos you have marked with a Heart
 - 4. Shared Album (if you have one)
 - 5. People: Uses Facial Recognition
 - 1. Select their picture and hame them
 - 2. Confirm unkowns
 - 6. Places: From GeoTags on Photos
 - 1. View by map
 - 2. Click on area to show pictures taken there
- 4. Media Types
 - 1. Videos
 - 2. Selfies
 - 3. Live Photos (Long Exposer)
 - 4. Portraits
 - 5. Panoramas
 - 6. Time-Lapse
 - 7. Slow Mo
 - 8. Bursts

 - 2. Can select and delete sooner
 - 3. Can recover deleted images

 - 1. Select photo and touch Trash
 - 2. Choose "Delete Photo"
 - 3. Photo is placed in Recently Deleted Album
 - 1. Stays there for 29 days
 - 4. Free Memory on iPhone
 - 1. Delete photo(s) from Recently Deleted Album
- 7. My Albums
 - 1. Collection of photos YOU create
 - 2. Can do on your iPhone
 - 3. Can be Synced with your Mac
 - 4. Can add photos to an existing album
- 8. CREATE A NEW ALBUM iOS up to 12.4
 - 1. Select some photos
 - 2. Click "Add To" at bottom
 - 3. Choose New Album or Existing Album
 - 4. Give New Album a name
 - 5. Click Save

 - 2. Click Share Button at bottom
 - 3. Choose Add to Album

 - 2. Choose the Circle with three dots
